



Care for your Faux Leather Drum Stools

We have built this product to last you for many years to come; however you'll want to treat it with care and respect. We've compiled a series of dos and don'ts to help you keep this unique item in tiptop condition.



When unpacking your item try to avoid using sharp knives or scissors as these may damage the outer upholstery layer.



Allow your product to settle in its new surroundings - foam and fabric may need to "condition" after a period of time being tightly packed whilst in transit.



In the event of a spill, act immediately. Faux leather is the ideal material to cope with spills and a mild detergent may help to remove stubborn stains although we recommend the use of professional cleaning services to attend more serious staining incidents.



Try not to let little ones (and not so little ones!) stand on the drum. Whilst we build each piece to UK contract furniture specifications excessive weight and strain can do long term damage to the foam underlay and the frame.



We also use high-density rigid foam that may become flattened when exposed to such conditions.



Please take care where you position your drum and for obvious reasons do not place it too close to hot radiators or open fires. All our drum footstools are produced to meet BS 5852 CRIB 5 FR (Flame Retardancy) regulations.



The Faux leather material may need "smoothing out" and conditioning to its new environment after transit to ensure its appearance and performance meets with your expectations.
